DONT - **D**ouble **O**f **N**o **Trump**

Using this convention, double also has a conventional meaning and so cannot be use as penalty. This is perhaps reasonable against a Strong NT opening but one really needs a penalty double when playing against the Weak NT.

Playing DONT the bids over the 1NT opening are: -

Dbl = A single suited hand. Partner is expected to bid 2. and you either pass this (with . s's) or correct into your suit.

2 = * s + another suit

 $2 \blacklozenge = \blacklozenge$'s and either \blacktriangledown 's or \blacktriangle 's

 $2 \checkmark = \checkmark$'s and \checkmark 's

 $2 \triangle = \triangle$'s

2NT = undefined, but best used as unusual (♣'s and ♠'s but wishing to raise the level more than a 2♣ bid would).

3-level bids are natural and pre-emptive (more destructive than double).

It's up to you if you want to define 2♠ as something else as a single suited ♠ hand can also be shown via double.
